Recommended tools/material		
Acrylic paint brushes, set of 3, flat acrylic brushes size 2, 6, 12	490342	1
Tools needed		
Protective cover, piece of paper, pen, ruler, scissors, glue, plastic bowl Cat (approx. Ø 15 cm; height: approx. 8 cm), plastic bowl Dog (approx. Ø 28 cm; height: approx. 10 cm), bucket for mixing the concrete (approx. 5 l), stirring spatula (or whisk); vegetable oil (or Formstone separating agent)		



1 Make the templates for the letters from rubber foam. Draw the letters on a piece of paper and cut them out. Place the templates on the foam, trace and cut out. Each letter is needed 3 x. Glue the same three letters on top of each other to reach the minimum height of 6 mm (using craft glue).



2 Fix the letters upside down and in mirror-image inside the plastic bowl, using craft glue.



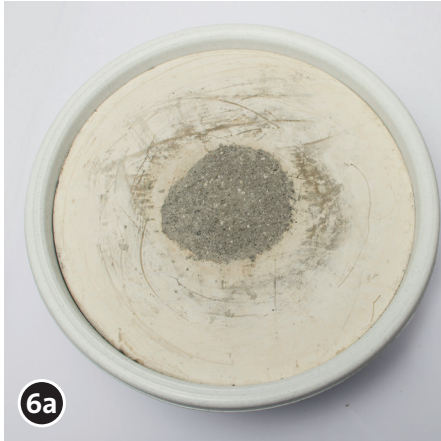
3a Affix the matching half sphere with the opening facing downwards in the plastic bowl (using craft glue). Let the glue dry.



4 Cover the inside of the bowl, the half sphere and the foam letters with plenty of vegetable oil (or separating agent).



5 Mix the creative concrete according to instructions. Carefully pour into the bowl.



After 24 hours remove the concrete from the bowl. Remove the letters and the half-sphere. Let the remaining dampness dry out properly.



Paint the inside of the bowl with saliva-proof paint if desired.

Hint

For more convenient handling and to protect the bowl against water the second half-sphere can be glued into the hollow of the pet bowl.
